

# Positive Behaviour for Learning PBL

- Wyrallah Road Public School is a 'Positive Behaviour for Learning' (PBL) school, taking a school wide, systematic and proactive approach to explicitly teaching expected behaviours.
- As a PBL school, teachers at WRPS explicitly teach expected behaviours covering the many different school settings. This is reinforced by both our formal and informal recognition systems.
- Each week, students have the opportunity to earn 2 Owlie Points (one for the classroom and one for the playground). When students achieve 14 Owlie Points, they have the opportunity to achieve a PBL badge.

#### **Curriculum Overview** Term 4

#### **Integrated Unit**



Term 4 – 'Inventions and Imaginitis'. This unit uses science and creative arts to explore the mind. Students will investigate What do we do when we have an idea? How can you turn an idea into reality? Can one idea change the world? What imaginary worlds can our minds create? We will also investigate forces and how objects move in response to a push or pull force.

### **Mathematics-** Term 4 focus areas:

- Whole number concepts
- Addition and subtraction relating to money
- Inverse relationships related to multiplication and division
- Fractions and decimals
- Solve missing algorithms related to the four operations
- Use scale and compass points related to position
- Describes and compares chance events in social and experimental contexts

### **English:**

- **Reading** Students will continue to strengthen their decoding skills, increase fluency and practice comprehension skills which will be explicitly taught. Students will engage in whole class, small group and independent activities focused on these skills and strategies.
- Writing Students will engage with a variety of texts including imaginary and persuasive writing as well as poetry. They will continue to learn about the writing process including brainstorming, planning, drafting, editing and publishing. Punctuation and Grammar rules are embedded through explicit teaching and regular opportunities to practise these skills. Handwriting lessons and activities are also timetabled throughout the week.
- **Spelling** Students will continue to learn through the Soundwaves spelling program in 2023. Each week, students will learn a new phoneme (basic unit of sound) and the associated grapheme (letter selections to represent the sounds) choices. Students engage in whole class interactive lessons, small group work and online games as part of this program.

PDHPE: Students will be involved in Interest Groups for sport (students have selected their own sport to participate in). In PDH, students will learn what health is and why it





## WYRALLAH ROAD is important, identify and explain the lifestyle aspects which make someone healthy and evaluate their own health and consider any improvements. Crunch and Sip Each day, students are encouraged to eat a serve of fresh fruit or vegetables and drink water during the morning session. This gives students an extra boost to get through the long morning session while they are working in class. Fruit is available at the canteen if necessary, but needs to be purchased before school. Supervision for students begins at 8:30am. Please do not drop your child off before this time. Parents requiring earlier drop off may wish to contact 'Helping Hands' before and after school care. If children are absent from school, parents are required to provide the school with an acceptable explanation within seven days of the absence. Explanations can be submitted via a written note, email to the teacher or through the SkoolBag Mobile App (search Wyrallah Road Public School in the App Store). Enrichment Group programs will continue for students in Years 3-6 this term. Students will be able to participate in one 45-minute activity each week, **Enrichment Groups** concluding in Week 4. Their effort and achievement will be reported upon in Semester 2 reports. Enrichment Groups will occur on Wednesdays between 12:10pm and 12:55pm. Homework will be sent home each week. Students can complete the work and **Homework and Home** return it to their classroom teacher the following week. Reading Reading at home is very important as it allows children to practise their reading skills and improve their general reading ability and comprehension. All students are encouraged to read at least 15 minutes each day. Students may use their own books from home, borrow from the library, or utilise our Home Reader collection here at school. Excursions to enhance classroom learning will be planned throughout the year along with one overnight excursion for both Year 3 and 4. Excursions are a wonderful opportunity for students to experience educational **Excursions** activities that we cannot provide in the classroom. All students are strongly encouraged to attend. If finances are a concern, please do not hesitate to contact the Stage 2 Assistant Principal. Year 4 Tyalgum Excursion – Wednesday 22 to Friday 24 November. All money and permission notes were due last term. Notes regarding what to pack, departure and arrival times will be sent out closer to the date. **Scripture and Ethics** Scripture lessons are on Wednesday afternoons for half an hour. These lessons are conducted by volunteers and are supervised by a classroom teacher. \*\* Religious 3% 🖈 Students' participation in the Scripture and Ethics programs will be based on their and Moral Education preference from 2022. Students who do not participate in religious education will be engaged in independent revision activities supervised by a classroom teacher.
