Curriculum Overview Term 1

Integrated Unit of Study:

This term we will be studying an integrated unit entitled 'Heroes and villains" covering syllabus outcomes across History, Geography, Creative Arts and Personal Development. Students be learning about characteristics of heroes and villains, comics, fractured fairy tales, real life heroes and celebrations/commemorations to honour these heroes.

English:

Reading – This term students will focus on learning explicit comprehension skills which will be introduced one at a time this term. These skills are: predicting, monitoring & clarifying, visualising, questioning, making connections and inferring. More information about these comprehension skills will be sent home when students commence home reading.



Writing - Students will be focusing on Narrative writing this term. We will be

learning the language and structural features involved in writing this genre such as orientation, complication, events and climax and resolution.

Spelling – In Week 5 this term the Stage 2 teachers will be undergoing training for a new spelling program. This program will be rolling out across Years 1-6. Each week students will be working on a phoneme (basic unit of sound) focus. You may notice this in your child's weekly homework.

Mathematics:

<u>Our goal for this term is to be able to recall all multiplication facts quickly for up to 10 x 10 – practising these at home regularly</u> will help you child commit these to memory and support their ability to solve multiplication problems mentally.

Term 1 focus areas:

- Place value of four digit numbers
- Addition and Subtraction (including money)
- Equivalent number sentences
- Fractions and decimals
- Multiplication (times tables)
- Recognising and classifying 2D shapes (including quadrilaterals)
- Measuring the volume of 3D objects
- Measuring length in millimetres, centimetres and metres
- Identifying the likelihood of events with the language of 'chance'
- Understanding calendars and elapsed time when reading timetables
