Welcome back, I trust everyone had an enjoyable holiday period. It's hard to believe it is Term 2 already!

As always there is lots happening and we will waste no time getting back into our routines.

1G has made a wonderful start to the year and we will be building on those gains throughout Term 2 and having lots of fun along the way!

English: Our writing focus this term centres on narrative texts. We are learning to write a narrative which tells a story with a series of events to entertain the reader. Students will learn the structure of a narrative and language features using the Seven Steps resource which focuses on a three step approach:

Step 1: Plan for Success Step 2: Sizzling Starts

Step 3: Tightening Tension

We will also be writing in response to some of the wonderfully rich texts we will be reading in class.

Reading groups continue to occur daily and operate on a rotating basis. Students are organised into small groups and work directly with the teacher on specific reading skills and strategies specific to that group. Groups not working directly with the teacher, engage independently in literacy tasks that support their spelling, phonics, handwriting, reading, comprehension and writing development.

development. **Spelling** – Last term we began a school wide phonics-based spelling program called Sound Waves. Each week we have a phoneme (sound) focus where students learn the various grapheme (letter) choices to spell that phoneme. Students can support their spelling learning at home with segmenting tools, word lists, games and activities through the Sound Waves student online access

Maths: We have established solid routines around maths lessons, including groupings and appropriate differentiation to cater for the different developmental stages within our class group. We will be covering syllabus strands of Number and Algebra, Measurement and Geometry, Statistics and Probability, underpinned by the processes and skills of Working Mathematically, with lots of hands-on and interactive learning opportunities.

Students have been given a Mathletics login username and password to access set work, games and activities at home to consolidate their mathematical learning in class. Please see your class teacher if you have misplaced your access codes.

Integrated unit: During Term 2, Stage 1 will be focusing on an integrated unit of work, 'Cool Australia'. Students will explore water as one of Earth's many resources. Students will investigate how water is obtained, used, cared for and

Through geographical inquiry, students will investigate water sources across Australia, identifying them at local and national levels and identify Australia's location in the world in relation to oceans and continents. Science Day: This week we have organised our first Science Day.
