**Curriculum Overview**  
**Term 2**



During Term 2 Kindergarten will be focusing on an integrated unit of work, 'Rainforest Safari'. This involves students developing an understanding of local places and using geographical tools to explore features of rainforests and the water cycle. They will learn about the features and characteristics of rainforests and have the opportunity to participate in an excursion to Rocky Creek Dam.

**Maths:** Students will be exploring telling the time on the hour, describing and naming 2D shapes (circles, triangles, rectangles and squares) in the environment, sorting and describing 3D shapes (cube, sphere, cone and prism) and measuring the volume of different objects.

**English:** Students begin their day with explicit teaching of synthetic phonics. Our L3 (Language, Learning and Literacy) program continues throughout the morning session in all Kinder classrooms, providing rich literacy experiences to assist all children to become successful readers and writers. Students participate in reading and writing lessons in small groups, designed to meet their specific learning needs. It provides rich literacy experiences through systematic and explicit teaching. They also engage in short periods of independent, individual or group tasks to practice and consolidate their current literacy learning. L3 responds to the learning needs of students as they progress in the acquisition of literacy skills.
