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	<ul> <li>Year 4 will undertake a day excursion to Currumbin where students will participate in a guided tour of an award winning sustainable community, learning important features of sustainable design including efficient energy and water use, thermal comfort and waste management. They will also take part in a sculpture workshop on the foreshore of Currumbin beach as part of the Swell Sculpture Festival and take a walk through the sculptures. The cost is \$32 and is due by Monday, 26 August. Please note no late payments will be taken as bookings must be confirmed on this date.</li> <li>Year 5 will be attending Camp Koinonia at Evans Head. As per the payment schedule, \$240 should now be paid, with the final instalment of \$50 being due on 9th August. Positive Behaviour for Learning PBL	Wyrallah Road Public School is a 'Positive Behaviour for Learning' (PBL) school, taking a school wide, systematic and proactive approach to explicitly teaching expected behaviours. As a PBL school, teachers at WRPS explicitly teach expected behaviours covering the many different school settings. This is reinforced by both our formal and informal recognition system.
Communication	At WRPS we understand and value the importance of effective communication and building relationships with our parents. Communication is one of the most important parts of the relationship between school and home as it helps us to better understand your child. We recognise that every child is a unique individual and begins school with varying social, emotional and learning needs.

	There will be times that we may contact you via phone or email. We like to contact parents to share wonderful learning moments, if we have any concerns or need to clarify any confusions regarding your child. We also may contact parents to discuss areas that may need some extra attention and a collaborative approach.

	<u>Units</u> – <i>Australian Colonies (History and Geography)</i> This topic provides a study of colonial Australia in the 1800s. Students look at the founding of British colonies and the development of a colony. They learn about what life was like for different groups in the colonial period. They examine significant events and people, political and economic developments, social structures and settlement patterns.
Life Cycles	<i>Living and Non-Living (Science)</i> During this unit, students will learn how to define living and non-living things. They will examine specimens and their observable features, explore the life stages and lifecycle of living things, explore biological areas within their school grounds to examine factors that affect living things and describe relationships between living things and study biodiversity.

These skills are: predicting, monitoring &amp; clarifying, visualising, questioning, making connections and inferring.</li> <li>Writing – Students will be focusing on informative and persuasive writing this term. We will be learning the language and structural features involved in writing these genres.</li> <li>Spelling – Students use the Soundwaves spelling program in daily spelling lessons.</li> <li>Students are explicitly taught how to break words into phonemes (sounds) and then select graphemes (written selections) that match these sounds. Students engage in small group work, written spelling activities, online interactive games and worksheets across the week.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Crunch and Sip	Each day students are encouraged to eat a piece of fresh fruit or vegetables and drink water during the morning session. This gives students an extra boost to get through the long morning session while they are working in class. Fruit is available at the canteen and needs to be purchased before school.
Homework	Homework will be handed out each Friday and needs to be returned each Friday. Homework is a revision of the work covered in class during the previous weeks and gives you the opportunity to see what content is being taught in class.
Home Reading	Home reading is very important as it allows children to practise their reading skills and improve their reading ability. Please remember to sign your child's home reading log and send it to school to be marked off. If your child has misplaced their log please let me know and I will organise a replacement.
School Fees	It is easier than ever to pay school fees with parent online payment (POP). This is a secure payment page hosted by Westpac. Log onto our school site at:- www.wyrallahrd- p.schools.nsw.edu.au If paying online does not suit, you can also pay in person at the front office (EFTPOS or cash) or write a cheque made out to Wyrallah Road Public School. \$55 per student, \$100 for two children or \$130 for a family of 3 or more children. Although voluntary, school fees are a vital part of our budget each year and pay for essential items in classrooms such as pencils, books and art supplies. Thank you in advance for your prompt payment.
Attendance	Supervision for students begins at 8:30am. Please do not drop your child off before this time. Assemblies	Every fortnight on a Friday (even weeks of the term) there will be a whole school assembly in the hall. All parents are warmly invited to attend. All classes will have a turn throughout the year at performing in a class item. Additional opportunities for performances may arise through enrichment groups and extra-curricular activities. Parents will be advised about when these are scheduled through the school newsletter. On alternating weeks (Fridays of odd weeks) we hold a stage assembly where various awards are distributed to recognise student achievement, participation in home reading and Positive Behaviour for Learning. A class award is also presented to the class that has met attendance targets for that fortnight.
