BANGARRA - KINSHIP

Last Wednesday, Year 4, 5 & 6 Aboriginal students and the Senior Dance Ensemble had the exciting opportunity to attend a performance by Bangarra at Lismore City Hall. Bangarra is an Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander organisation and one of Australia's leading performing arts companies, widely acclaimed nationally and around the world for its powerful dancing, distinctive theatrical voice and utterly unique soundscapes, music and design. Students were treated to two performance pieces: Kinship (Brolga and ID) which celebrate and explore Indigenous culture and perspectives. Kinship opened with Brolga (Gudurrku), a creation story inspired by the totemic systems in the Australian Aboriginal culture where every individual is assigned a creature totem related to their clan. The second work in the Kinship program is ID. This work investigates being Aboriginal in the 21st century, asking important questions about The students thoroughly enjoyed the identity. experience and were mesmerised by the outstanding lighting, sound, costumes and performances.
