


Stage 1 Newsletter Term 2

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Curriculum Overview Term 2



English

Writing- Year 1- Our writing focus this term will be around rhyme and recounts. Students will learn the language features involved within these texts. We will also be writing in response to some of the wonderfully rich texts we will be reading in class.

Year 2- Our writing focus this term centres on informative and imaginative texts. Students will learn the language features involved within imaginative texts such as complex sentences, prepositional phrases and time connectives.

Spelling – We will continue our K-2 phonics-based spelling program through Decodables Readers Australia. Each week we have focus phonemes (sounds) where students learn the various grapheme (letter) choices to spell those phonemes.

Reading- Students are developing fluency in their reading by rereading a familiar text to promote smoothness and expression in reading. Based on the current research, cumulative practice and repetition in reading a familiar text, develops accuracy, rate and expression while supporting deeper comprehension. The number of repetitions matters;

- 1-4 repetitions for an *outstanding* student
- 4-14 for a *sound* student
- 14-40 for a *developing* student

Maths: We have established solid routines around maths lessons, including

groupings and appropriate differentiation to cater for the different developmental stages within our class group. We will be covering syllabus strands of Number and Algebra, Measurement and Geometry, Statistics and Probability, underpinned by the processes and skills of Working Mathematically, with lots of hands-on and interactive learning opportunities.

Integrated unit: 'Hocus Pocus'

This is a science-focused unit based around the Material World, where we will investigate the properties of everyday materials and how these can be physically changed. We will conduct experiments to explore these concepts and write about what we find. We will also detect sources of light and sound encountered in our daily lives.

Key inquiry questions:

- **Physical World**- What are the different forms of energy and how can we detect them? How are forces used for a purpose?
- **Material world**- What changes occur when materials are combined? How do the properties of materials determine their use?
- **History**- How has changing technology effected people's lives over time?

Homework:

Students have been given a Mathletics login username and password to access set work, games and activities at home to consolidate their mathematical learning in class. Please see your class teacher if you have misplaced your access codes or have any problems accessing this online.

Home Reading: Thank you for your continued support with Home Reading. Home reading occurs from Monday to Thursday with the book they are currently reading returned on Friday. Repeated reading of the same book will allow your child to develop the required skills of blending and fluency to become confident skilled readers. Their home reading book will be renewed the following Monday with a new reader.

* *Fluency is being able to read text quickly, accurately and with expression.*

- The decodable reader that your child brings home will have been introduced in class.
- Books that students read will only contain phonemes that have been previously taught.
- Please remember to record the book each time your child reads. This is essential information for teacher reference. Students receive a Home Reading Award to celebrate every 10 nights of reading.
- Additional books may be accessed through the online library, using a school login provided. Teachers will unlock books appropriate to the reading skills of each student. Again, we encourage multiple readings of the same online text to ensure the development of the required skills of blending and fluency.

Assembly: Whole school assemblies are conducted fortnightly recognising student achievement and effort through merit awards and positive student behaviour choices through PBL awards. Each assembly is also a time to showcase the work that is occurring across the school through class, choir and instrumental performances, drama and more. This occurs on a Friday afternoon (even weeks) from 2:10pm in the school hall. There is no whole
